



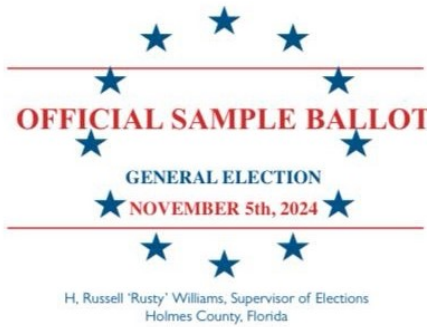

Take a picture and signature ID to the Polls or Early Voting Locations

- Acceptable forms of ID include:**
- Florida driver's license
 - Florida identification card issued by Department of Highway Safety and Transportation
 - United States Passport
 - Military ID
 - Retirement Center ID
 - Public Assistance ID
 - Veteran Health ID card issued by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs
 - License to carry a concealed weapon or firearm issued pursuant to Florida law
 - Employee ID card issued by any branch, department, agency, or organization of the state, county, or a municipality.

Florida law requires that a voter present current and valid picture and signature ID when voting in person. Any voter appearing to vote without identification will be asked to provide identification.

- Make sure our office has received your voted ballot by 7:00 p.m. Election night.

Florida is a closed primary state. What does this mean? Only voters who are registered members of a political party may vote for that party's candidates in a primary election, UNLESS the race is a Universal Primary Contest. A Universal Primary Contest occurs when all candidates in the same race have the same party affiliation and the winner will have no opposition in the General Election. All eligible voters can vote in a Universal Primary Contest. The deadline for a voter to make a party change for the General Election is October 7th, 2024. All eligible voters regardless of party affiliation may vote on Nonpartisan offices.

However, partisan primary elections may occur before the 2026 general election for purposes of nominating political party candidates to that office for placement on the 2026 general election ballot.</p> <p><input checked="" type="radio"/> Yes <input type="radio"/> No</p> <p>No. 2 Constitutional Amendment Article I, Section 28</p> <p>Right to Fish and Hunt</p> <p>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to preserve forever fishing and hunting, including by the use of traditional methods, as a public right and preferred means of responsibly managing and controlling fish and wildlife. <p>Representative in Congress District 2 (Vote for One)</p> <p><input checked="" type="radio"/> Neal Dunn</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Yen Bailey</p>	<p>No. 3 Constitutional Amendment Article X, Section 23</p> <p>Adult Personal Use of Marijuana</p> <p>Allows adults 21 years or older to possess, purchase, or use marijuana products and marijuana accessories for non-medical personal consumption by smoking, ingestion, or otherwise; allows Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers, and other state licensed entities, to acquire, cultivate, process, manufacture, sell, and distribute such products and accessories. Applies to Florida law; does not change, or immunize violations of, federal law. Establishes possession limits for personal use. Allows consistent legislation. Defines terms. Provides effective date.</p> <p>The amendment's financial impact primarily comes from expected sales tax collections. If legal today, sales of non-medical marijuana would be subject to sales tax and would remain so if voters approve this amendment. Based on other states' experiences, expected retail sales of non-medical marijuana would generate at least \$195.6 million annually in state and local sales tax revenues once the retail market is fully operational, although the timing of this occurring is unclear. Under current law, the existing statutory framework for medical marijuana is repealed six months after the effective date of this amendment which affects how this amendment will be implemented. A new regulatory structure for both medical and nonmedical use of marijuana will be needed. Its design cannot be fully known until the legislature acts; however, regulatory costs will probably be offset by regulatory fees. Other potential costs and savings cannot be predicted. THIS PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT IS ESTIMATED TO HAVE A NET POSITIVE IMPACT ON THE STATE BUDGET. <p>State Representative District 5 (Vote for One)</p> <p><input checked="" type="radio"/> Shane Abbott</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Stephanie Lyn Leonard</p>	<p>No. 4 Constitutional Amendment Article I, New Section</p> <p>Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion</p> <p>No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion before viability or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider. This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.</p> <p>The proposed amendment would result in significantly more abortions and fewer live births per year in Florida. The increase in abortions could be even greater if the amendment invalidates laws requiring parental consent before minors undergo abortions and those ensuring only licensed physicians perform abortions. There is also uncertainty about whether the amendment will require the state to subsidize abortions with public funds. Litigation to resolve those and other uncertainties will result in additional costs to the state government and state courts that will negatively impact the state budget. An increase in abortions may negatively affect the growth of state and local revenues over time. Because the fiscal impact of increased abortions on state and local revenues and costs cannot be estimated with precision, the total impact of the proposed amendment is indeterminate.
