Specifies that the amendment does not limit the authority granted to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission under Section 9 of Article IV of the State Constitution.</p>	<p>Under current law, the existing statutory framework for medical marijuana is repeated six months after the effective date of this amendment which affects how this amendment will be implemented. A new regulatory structure for both medical and nonmedical use of marijuana will be needed. Its design cannot be fully known until the legislature acts, however, regulatory costs will probably be offset by regulatory fees. <p><b>Partisan Election of Members of District School Boards</b></p> <p>Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to require members of a district school board to be elected in a partisan election rather than a nonpartisan election and to specify that the amendment only applies to elections held on or after the November 2025 general election. Applies to Florida law, does not change, or immunize violations of, federal law. Establishes possession limits for personal use. Allows consistent legislation. Defines terms. Provides effective date. The amendment's financial impact primarily comes from expected sales tax collections. If legal today, sales of non-medical marijuana would be subject to sales tax and would remain so if voters approve this amendment. Based on other states' experiences, expected retail sales of non-medical marijuana would generate at least \$195.5 million annually in state and local sales tax revenues once the retail market is fully operational, although the timing of this occurring is unclear.</p>	<p>Autómatas que los adultos de 21 años de edad o mayores posean, compren o utilicen productos y accesorios de marihuana para consumo personal que no sea medicinal mediante el tabaquismo, por ingestión o de otra manera. Define los términos. Define la fecha de vigencia. El impacto financiero de la enmienda proviene en primer lugar de la reducción impositiva futura sobre las ventas. Si hoy es legal, las ventas de marihuana con fines no medicinales estarían sujetas al impuesto sobre las ventas y seguirían siendo si los videntes aprueban esta enmienda. Según las experiencias de otros estados, las ventas minoristas futuras de marihuana no medicinal generarán al menos \$195.5 millones anuales en ingresos por impuestos estatales y locales sobre las ventas una vez que el mercado minorista esté en pleno funcionamiento, aunque no está claro el momento en que esto ocurrirá. Según la ley vigente, el marco legal existente para la marihuana medicinal queda derogado con efecto seis meses después de la fecha de esta enmienda, lo que afecta la toma en que se implementará esta enmienda. Se necesitará una nueva estructura regulatoria para el uso medicinal y no medicinal de la marihuana. No se puede conocer su diseño en su totalidad hasta que actúe la Legislatura; sin embargo, los costos regulatorios probablemente serán compensados por las tarifas regulatorias. This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion. Financial and State Budget Impact Statements</p> <p>The proposed amendment would result in significantly more abortions and fewer live births per year in Florida. The increase in abortions could be even greater if the amendment invalidates laws requiring parental consent before minors undergo abortions and those ensuring only licensed physicians perform abortions. There is also uncertainty about whether the amendment will require the state to subsidize abortions with public funds. Litigation to resolve those and other uncertainties will result in additional costs to the state government and state courts that will negatively impact the state budget. An increase in abortions may negatively affect the growth of state and local revenues over time. Because the fiscal impact of increased abortions on state and local revenues and costs cannot be estimated with precision, the total impact of the proposed amendment is indeterminate. <b>THE FINANCIAL IMPACT OF THIS AMENDMENT CANNOT BE DETERMINED DUE TO AMBIGUITIES AND UNCERTAINTIES SURROUNDING THE AMENDMENT'S IMPACT.</b></p> <p><b>Enmienda Para Limitar La Interferencia Gubernamental en El Aborto</b></p> <p>Ninguna ley prohibirá, penalizará, retrasará o restringirá el aborto antes de su viabilidad o cuando sea necesario para proteger la salud de la paciente, según lo determine el proveedor de servicios de salud de la paciente. **EXECUTIVE BOARD RESOLUTIONS**  
*2024 Constitutional Amendments*

**WHEREAS**, it is vital that all Republicans be fully informed and educated regarding the proposed amendments to Florida's Constitution appearing on the 2024 General Election ballot;

**WHEREAS, AMENDMENT 1**, proposed by joint resolution of the Florida Legislature and entitled *Partisan Election of Members of District School Boards*, which requires members of a district school board to be elected in a partisan election rather than a nonpartisan election and will apply beginning in the 2026 elections;

**WHEREAS, AMENDMENT 2**, proposed by joint resolution of the Florida Legislature and entitled *Right to Fish and Hunt*, which preserves forever fishing and hunting, including by use of traditional methods, as a public right and preferred means of responsibly managing and controlling fish and wildlife;

**WHEREAS, AMENDMENT 3**, proposed by citizen initiative and entitled *Adult Personal Use of Marijuana*, which legalizes recreational marijuana throughout Florida in order to benefit powerful marijuana special interests, while putting children at risk and endangering Florida's family-friendly business and tourism climates;

**WHEREAS, AMENDMENT 4**, proposed by citizen initiative and entitled *Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion*, which dramatically expands and legalizes the systemic killing of unborn babies in the state of Florida, potentially up until birth under the guise of "protecting women's health", and destroys the ability of the people's elected representatives to pass common-sense protections for women and unborn babies, and the RPOF State Executive Committee has officially declared its opposition to this misleading amendment;

**WHEREAS, AMENDMENT 5**, proposed by joint resolution of the Florida Legislature and entitled *Annual Adjustments to the Value of Certain Homestead Exemptions*, which requires an annual adjustment for inflation to the value of current or future homestead exemptions that apply solely to levies other than school district levies; and


WHEREAS, AMENDMENT 6, proposed by joint resolution of the Florida Legislature and entitled *Repeal of Public Campaign Financing Requirement*, which repeals the requirement for public financing for campaigns of candidates for elective statewide office who agree to campaign spending limits.

NOW THEREFORE MAY IT BE RESOLVED, that the Republican Party of Florida Executive Board officially recommends the following votes at the 2024 General Election regarding the proposed amendments to the Florida Constitution:

1. A "YES" vote on Amendment 1, *Partisan Election of Members of District School Boards*.
2. A "YES" vote on Amendment 2, *Right to Fish and Hunt*.
3. A "NO" vote on Amendment 3, *Adult Personal Use of Marijuana*.
4. A "NO" vote on Amendment 4, *Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion*.
5. A "YES" vote on Amendment 5, *Annual Adjustments to the Value of Certain Homestead Exemptions*.
6. A "YES" vote on Amendment 6, *Repeal of Public Campaign Financing Requirement*.
